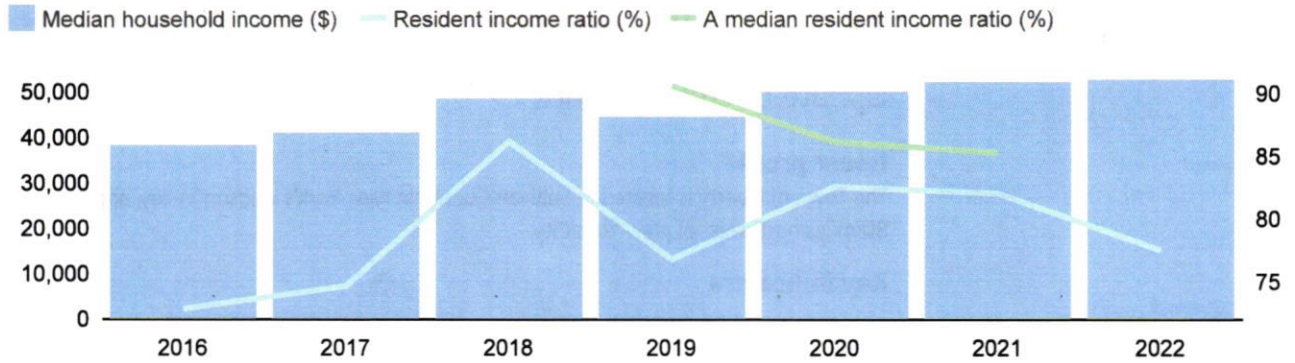

Resident Income

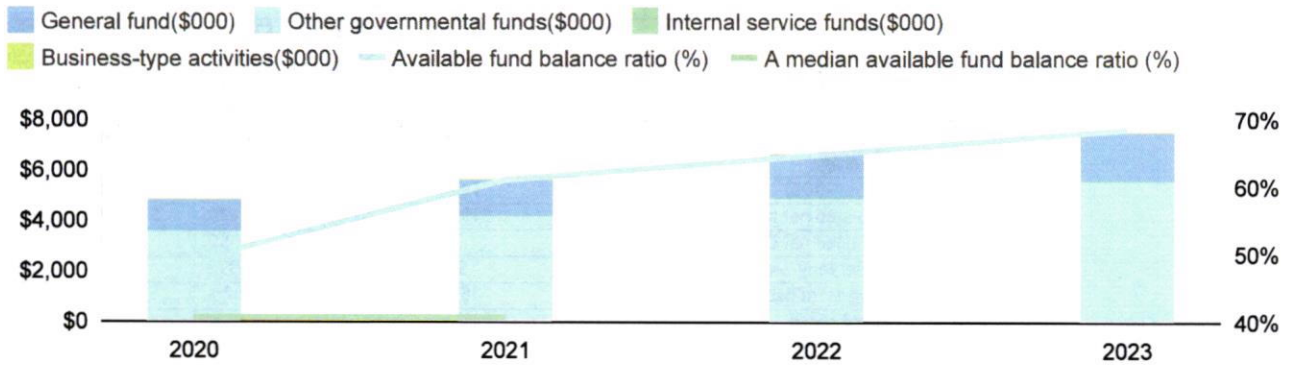

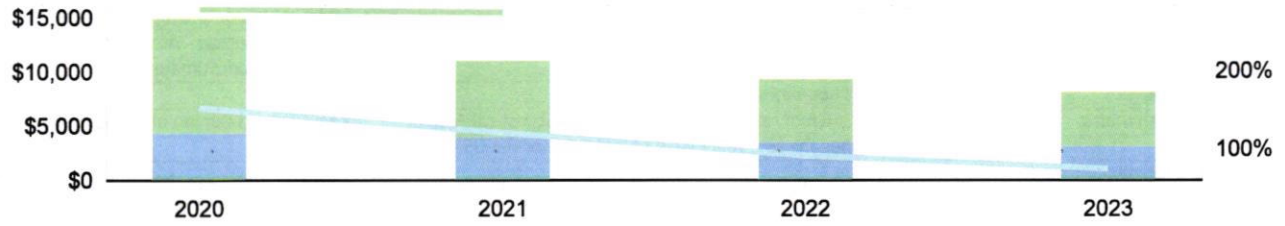

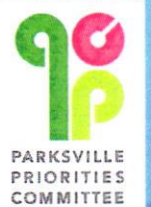

Take a Walk Back in Time in Liberty

Liberty, NY The public is invited to enjoy a special display, featuring the five-story Walnut Mountain House hotel built on the summit of Walnut Mt. in 1887, on view in the window of the Liberty Museum and Arts Center, 46 South Main Street, Liberty, NY. The display is lit up at night, making it a 24-hour exhibition!

A mile away at Walnut Mountain Park, the building's foundation can still be seen and carriage roads leading to it are now part of the trail network at Walnut Mountain Park. Come learn about this part of Liberty history in the window of the Liberty Museum and pick up your own trail map to go see the foundation for yourself. You might catch the history bug and want to help the research team fill in missing details!

There will be a Self-Guided History Walk along the route to the Walnut Mountain House during the holidays, prepared by the research team and co-sponsored by Liberty Park & Recreation. This effort is part of an interpretive panel project underway with the Town of Liberty.

Walnut Mountain is a 279-acre Town Park with historic carriage roads and more recently constructed Mountain Bike trails adding to Liberty Parks and Recreation's trail network.

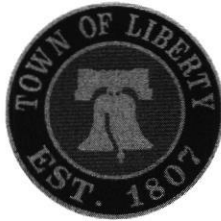

 - Eastern Electric Contracting - \$15,100
 - Ross Electric - \$12,852.00 (contractor did not fill out provided bid sheet or schedule as requested, and is considered a bid informality)
- The Town has the option waive any informalities and award to either contractor

- At the August 5, 2024 meeting the Town resolve to:
 - Award of the Sherwood Roth Booster Pump Electrical Upgrade work to Eastern Electric Contracting at a bid price of \$15,150 based on their 7/24/24 response
 - Authorize the Town Director of Finance to issue a purchase order for this work and send to Eastern Electrical Contracting

8. Ferndale Rd/Ferndale Loomis Road Intersection Waterline Crossing

Background

- The barrier that protects the waterline crossing from traffic traveling south-east on the Ferndale Loomis Road (Steep Grade) has been struck by larger vehicles three time since 2021. See photos and plan (attached)
- In the most recent event, the impact moved the barrier so that it is now touching the piping, and may have moved the vertical section of waterline out of alignment. It appears that the barrier may be cast around the vertical segment of pipe. See detail on plan (attached)
- **In its current state it seems stable but it might break the line if it sustains another impact**
- The Town Highway Department has worked with the County to place "Steep Grade" signs at the top of the Ferndale Loomis Road
- Damon and Cheryl have asked us to work with the Town to provide a recommendation for repair and get costs/proposals to complete the repairs, that will be submitted to the insurance company of the business/motorist at fault
- The nearby County bridge and guiderails sustained significant damage in the two recent events, the County wishes to repair the bridge structure and replace the guiderail this season before the traffic in that area increases
- At this time, the recommended repair would be to isolate and shut down the crossing, demo existing barrier, and install a new barrier that is similar to the existing (due to limited space). It is unlikely that the work required to complete repair (demo existing and cast new barrier) will be able to be completed without shutting down the line, and would be without service, for possibly up to a month
- Need to review and confirm with the Town Water & Sewer Dept:
 - What needs to be done to shut that line down?
 - Can temporary service be installed (e.g., hydrant to hydrant) at/near the bridge?
 - Is there a secondary supply?
 - If no secondary supply, how long can this line be down for?

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- The County is considering the possibility of working with the Town to complete the necessary repairs through an intermunicipal agreement (IMA) with the Town, but may ultimately decline considering the close proximity to the Town's waterline

9. Loomis Clarifier Repair

 - After board approval, all FAST NY projects must go through ESD's public hearing process and subsequently be approved by the Public Authorities Control Board (estimated time frame of 60 days)
 - Payments will be made as frequently as quarterly, pro-rata according to ESD's share of the project, on a cost-incurred basis
 - Need to complete SEQR, SHPO, SGIS
 - There is a one percent (1%) non-reimbursable commitment fee assessed to all

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awardees based on the grant amount awarded (\$200,280). The commitment fee will be due when the applicant executes documents required for processing the award, following approval by ESD Directors

- This award shall terminate two calendar years from the date of this letter if the project has not commenced
 - The federal funding can be used for the match requirement
- **\$1 USEPA STAG CWSRF/Congressionally Directed Spending (CDS) Grant (federal)**
- A conference call was held with EPA on 10/3/24
 - The cost share requirement will be 20% of the total cost of the project plus the additional 80% from the Community Grant (\$1,000,000 (80%) + \$250,000 community match (20%) to total \$1,250,000 million)
 - The match can be any other source of funds except other federal dollars
 - Require National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) review

Engineering

- In 2021 the *Sullivan County Partnership for Economic Development* asked *Delaware Engineering, D.P.C.*, developed a scope and cost to extend water and sewer capabilities to the Business Park 1 (total estimated project cost of \$18M)
- In 2023 the *Sullivan County Division of Planning, Community Development and Environmental Management*, used Delaware Engineering, D.P.C.'s 2021 estimate to apply for Interior and Environment- Clean Water CDS, Drinking Water CDS funds the *Other Cost from the 2021 Delaware Engineering* estimate for Project Design to advance critical water and sewer infrastructure upgrades in the Sullivan County Town of Liberty to resolve existing water quality issues and allow for up to 1.4 million square feet of new commercial/ industrial development
 - **This effort was awarded a \$1 EPA STAG CWSRF/Congressionally Directed Spending (CDS) Grant**
- In 2024 the *Sullivan County Partnership for Economic Development* asked Delaware Engineering, D.P.C. to update the 2021 estimate to upgrade water and sewer capabilities to Business Park 1 (total estimated project cost of \$24M) to apply for Fast NY Grant for design, construction, and utility infrastructure work Business Park 1
 - **This effort was awarded a \$20M Fast NY Grant**

My plea to the board is that whatever materials they put together for that meeting are more detailed and more accurate than the ones we received at the last meeting on the sewer upgrade, which was in May at the Swan Lake Firehouse, particularly in relation to the tax implications for taxpayers. Not on the basis of some hypothetical situation, but on an actual basis of how much different people will pay because their variations will be significant. That I think it's, it's really, really important that everyone understands what they're actually going to be paying, not what they might be paying on some generalized theoretical basis.

Secondly that they provide much more detail on cost sharing and cost reduction strategies. Which were pretty much completely absent apart from obtaining more grants, which will obviously be very useful. For example, in relation to how capital units are allocated, which at the moment is difficult to comprehend in terms of how that actually happens. Secondly, in terms of how out of district users will be charged, presumably that will be a different rate to industry users, the way of cost recovery.

Thirdly, in relation to charging large developers some form of joining field, whatever you call it, bearing in mind, they're going to be saving substantially by not putting in their own package plants, but by having access to a municipal plant, which everyone else pays for. So in addition to the work that's already been going on by now on obtaining more grants and so forth, I think it's really important that you show that you've taken notice of what people said last time about the enormous cost of this, for those of us who live in Swan Lake and are going to pay for it and are doing whatever you can to reduce the cost through these and other measures.

**RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE A PUBLIC HEARING
FOR THE ADOPTION OF A LOCAL LAW**

WHEREAS, there has been introduced at a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Liberty held on November 4, 2024 a proposed Local Law No. of 2024, entitled "A local law to amend Chapter of the Town of Liberty Code relating to zoning".

WHEREAS, KBSL HOLDINGS LLC ("KBSL") by petition dated August 30, 2024 has applied to this Board to change the zoning of two parcels, 40.-1-8.1 consisting of 32.2 acres and 44.-1-12.1 consisting of 42.9 acres from an RD zone to an R-1 zone; and

WHEREAS, said parcels are shown on a map attached hereto as exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, each of the foregoing parcels are contiguous to an R-1 zone (as shown on exhibit "A"); and

WHEREAS, in consideration of the Board's approval of said zoning change, KBSL has offered to cause, by deed restriction, lot 40.-1-5.2 consisting of 130.57 acres to be a conservation parcel upon which no construction can take place; and

WHEREAS, the conservation parcel 40.-1-5.2 is shown on exhibit "A" as being in an RD zone, adjacent to Swan Lake; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid parcels subject to re-zoning from RD to R-1 would allow under the present zoning code of this Town for the construction of approximately 327 residential units and amenities; and

WHEREAS, for the reasons set forth below the aforesaid parcels subject to a zoning change will be restricted to the construction of no more than 180 residential units and amenities; and

WHEREAS, this Board has determined that the aforesaid zoning change would be in the best interest of the Town for the following reasons:

a. The zoning change would allow construction of a greater amount of residential units than if the parcels remained in an RD zone while at the same time limiting the amount of such residential units in consideration of the parcels location next to and adjacent to Swan Lake and a more densely trafficked Kelly Bridge Road. Furthermore, the

potential construction of up to 180 residential units will significantly add to the assessment and tax base of the Town.

b. The conservation parcel 40.-1-5.2 will preserve the views of and to Swan Lake, avoid possible contamination of Swan Lake by construction and placement of the residential units, and be forever wild.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that a public hearing be held to change the zoning of parcels 40.-1-8.1 and 44.-1-12.1 from an RD zone to an R-1 zone upon the condition no more than 180 residential units can be constructed cumulatively on both parcels and that parcel 40.-1-5.2 be a conservation parcel upon which no construction may take place, on November 18, 2024 at 7:30 p.m. or soon thereafter as said Public Hearing shall be convened, at the Senior Citizen Center, 119 North Main Street, Liberty, NY 12754, and at least three (3) days notice of such Public Hearing be given by due posting thereof on the bulletin board of the Town of Liberty and by publishing such notice at least once in the official newspaper of said Town.

38.2 Relation to Water Works Structures

While no general statement can be made to cover all conditions, it is generally recognized that sewers shall meet the requirements of the appropriate reviewing agency with respect to minimum distances from public water supply wells and other water supply sources or structures.

All existing waterworks units, such as basins, wells, or other treatment units, within 200 feet (60 m) of the proposed sewer shall be shown on the engineering plans.

Soil conditions in the vicinity of the proposed sewer within 200 feet (60 m) of waterworks units shall be determined and shown on the engineering plans.

38.3 Relation to Water Mains

38.31 Horizontal and Vertical Separation

Sewers shall be laid at least 10 feet (3 m) horizontally from any existing or proposed water main. The distance shall be measured edge to edge. For gravity sewers where it is not practical to maintain a 10 foot (3 m) separation, the appropriate reviewing agency may allow deviation on a case-by-case basis, if supported by data from the design engineer. Such deviation may allow installation of the gravity sewer closer to a water main, provided that the water main is in a separate trench or on an undisturbed earth shelf located on one side of the gravity sewer and at an elevation so the bottom of the water main is at least 18 inches (460 mm) above the top of the sewer.

If it is impossible to obtain proper horizontal and vertical separation as described above for gravity sewers, both the water main and gravity sewer shall be constructed of slip-on or mechanical joint pipe complying with Section 8.1 and Section 8.7 of the "Recommended Standards for Water Works – 2012 Edition" and shall be pressure rated to at least 150 psi (1034 kPa) and pressure tested to ensure watertightness.

38.32 Crossings

Sewers crossing water mains shall be laid to provide a minimum vertical distance of 18 inches (460 mm) between the outside of the water main and the outside of the sewer. This shall be the case where the water main is either above or below the sewer. The crossing shall be arranged so that the sewer joints will be equidistant and as far as possible from the water main joints. Where a water main crosses under a sewer, adequate structural support shall be provided for the sewer to maintain line and grade.

When it is impossible to obtain proper horizontal and vertical separation as stipulated above, one of the following methods shall be specified:

- a. The sewer shall be designed and constructed equal to water pipe, as described in Paragraph 38.31.
- b. Either the water main or the sewer line may be encased in a watertight carrier pipe that extends 10 feet (3 m) on both sides of the crossing, measured perpendicular to the water main. The carrier pipe shall be made of materials approved by the regulatory agency for use in water main construction.
